

Midsummer Newsletter 23 – 28th June 2022

It has been a while since our last Newsletter, obviously, due in the main to the club being closed for the summer. However, whilst most of us are enjoying playing outdoors in the fresh air, life at Ilford indoors does go on.

The adjacent school have been using our facilities since April for the exam season and they are due to vacate very soon thus giving us back access to the club which is restricted whilst the exams are on. Bob Hayter will be contacting you all very soon with a view to getting help taking up the protective floor boards. The boards were put down this year in record time and our thanks go to all those members who kindly helped all for the price of one of Bob's special bacon rolls. When Bob contacts you, please step up and help if you can. Further information on this to follow.

We still get members asking why we do not play in the summer. Letting the hall out to the school brings in considerable income for little or no expense but this is not the only reason we do not play in the summer. Just before Covid changed our lives forever, we conducted a survey of all 300 members. Only about 60 bothered to reply and of those only about 40 wanted to play. That was not enough positive response to stop the closure in the summer months. We will keep this under review but I cannot see the policy changing in the foreseeable future as many of the Management Team are involved in running their outdoor clubs.

Before the floor boards come up, we take the opportunity to carry out some high level cleaning and maintenance. Often we hire a tower to access things like the heater and the fans... The heating will be serviced in July.

We have placed an order to replace the carpet around the green. It's about '200 years' old and well past it's sell by date. Once done the club will look a lot fresher and more modern. Just another example of the work that goes on behind the scenes. There are also some changes to the lighting in areas such as the changing rooms. Sensors will be fitted so that the lights are not kept burning when these areas are not in use. There will also be improvements to the lighting in the bar area where we will be installing LED spotlights which are energy efficient and more welcoming. All this is to help keep down spiralling running costs. Hopefully all this work will be completed before the club reopens on the 19th September 2022. Whilst open for roll ups, the league

program does not begin until the following Monday the 26th September. The bar will not be open during the first week as it has to be restocked and the pipes thoroughly cleaned.

On the subject of the internal leagues, we <u>urgently</u> need another <u>Monday 2:30 team</u>. We have seven teams but this means that one team does not play each week. That causes fixture congestion and loss of income. With eight teams, all can play every week. If you are interested in joining a new team and in particular, in running it, please contact Bob as soon as possible. Do not worry if you have never run a team before, help is readily available. Don't forget, all our leagues are mixed so the new team can comprise of men, women or a mixture of both.

It is still planned to re-paint the rear wall of the club and this will be organised and carried out by Tony Seago when the school vacates.

The Handbooks for the 22/23 season do not go to print until mid-July. There is still time for you, your company or your family to help us with the printing costs. A full page portrait advert will cost £100 and a half page landscape ad, just £60. This is an excellent way to advertise your services to over 300 people at very little cost so please support the club. An advertisement form will be attached to the email we send out with this Newsletter. We also have wall advertising space. Some is already taken up with adverts from our sponsor, Lexus Woodford. We are pleased to welcome Ian Treleaven as a new Director of the club. Many of you will know Ian and appreciate that it is he who looks after our garden areas. I am sure he will be a real asset to IIBC and we look forward to working with him in the new season.

We have sadly lost several members since the club closed. In particular, Keith Lloyd who helped run the bar and Ivor Kabel. Also members or past members, Frank Martin and George Marshall. Our sincere condolences go to their families and friends. This teaches us that life is too short so we have to live our lives for today and enjoy every moment.

Unfortunately, Covid is still lurking around so existing Covid measures will be reviewed and reintroduced as and when necessary. The Government have issued new guidelines and are about to remove almost all of the restrictions surrounding Covid but we will follow EIBA recommendations... Summary of the AGM held on the 10th April 2022

The minutes of the AGM meeting on the 11^{th} April 2021 were unanimously adopted.

There were reports from the President, Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Club Manager, Ladies Captain, Gents Captain and the League Secretary. Either these were read out at the meeting or copies were handed out to those present.

Club Directors Carol Tresadern and Sandra Dupuy, retired in rotation and stood for re-election. Both were re-elected for a further three years. In addition, Ian Treleaven was appointed a Director with immediate effect. Gerry Gillan agreed to stay on as a Director for a further year or until a successor was found.

Thanks were given to retiring Director Louis Dightmaker who stood down as Health, Safety and Security Director after many years of loyal service. He will be very hard to replace. It is now essential that we appoint a new Health, Safety and Security Director/officer as soon as possible, to look after this important area of the business and to guide the club through various health and safety regulations and matters. It is hoped that someone can be appointed from the membership but if not, we might have to employ outside consultants and that would have a major cost implication for the club. Bob Hayter will approach certain members who might be able to assist.

It was agreed and confirmed by a vote, that the fees for 2023 should be increased to £80 per annum from the 1^{st} January 2023 which is below the rate of current inflation. This is the first increase for 3 years. The annual fee for social members will also be increased to £40 per annum for the year commencing the 1^{st} January 2023.

However, it was also proposed and agreed that the green fees for 2023 will NOT be increased with the exception of weekend friendly matches. These fees will rise to £4 with effect from the 1^{st} September 2022.

We are mindful of rising costs for not only the club but for our members. It was therefore reluctantly agreed that green fees will have to rise in 2024. The increase will be discussed at the next AGM in 2023.

Thanks were given to the Ladies Captain Sandra Dupuy who stood down from this role. Her place will be taken by Sonia McDonald and we hope the woman members will support Sonia and vice-captain Carole Barry in this difficult job.

Last year we raised over £800 for our nominated charity, NHS Together. Each year the club appoints a different charity. There were seven nominations. A secret ballot was conducted and this year our Charity will be the **Essex Air Ambulance Service**. Please support this very worthy cause if and when asked.

There were several problems towards the end of the season with competition matches not being played on time for apparently good reasons in most cases. It was proposed to amend the Club's Constitution to give the Board of Directors more autonomy and leeway to change dates at their discretion. After a fiery debate the proposal was narrowly defeated. This means that the competition rules as set out in the Club's Handbook cannot be altered under any circumstances and Club competitions must be played by, in the case of preliminary rounds, or on, in the case of finals, the given dates as published in the Handbook. Please do not enter these competitions unless you will be available for the finals.

There was a further proposal that substitutes should be allowed in all league matches under certain circumstances. After discussion this proposal was also voted against on the basis that the system could be abused.

The proposal to scrap the handicap system for the ladies leagues was approved and will take effect from the start of the 2022/2023 season.
