New competitions for 2023

It has been a very busy and productive time at the club and we are pleased to announce that we have over 30 new members which as you will see below, takes our tally to over 300 members for the first time for several years. Of course we have to factor in that we have lost some of our older members who are no longer able to play for health reasons or have moved away from the area. We give thanks to them for supporting the club for many years and we wish them well for the future.

New members are the lifeblood of the club and we welcome all of you to what is considered to be, one of the friendliest and welcoming clubs in the area. Whilst some of you are already experienced bowlers, some are beginners and as such we are able to offer you help and coaching where we can, up to a certain level. If you need further help or training, we do have access to some qualified level 1 and 2 coaches. These coaches may make a charge but they are there to help you improve and compete at a higher level. Ask at the office for further details.

To encourage our new members to participate in our leagues and friendlies, we are delighted to announce that we have reintroduced the extremely popular **Newbies competition** which this season will be held on Wednesday the 22nd March 2023 from 12:00pm onwards. This competition is open to ALL new members who joined the club since it reopened in September 2022, regardless of gender, age or ability. If you qualify for this competition, you will have already received an emailed invitation. Please complete the application form and submit it to the office with your £10 entrance fee. Entries are limited to just 32 players and will be allocated on a first come first **PAID** basis. If you have completed an entry form but not yet paid, your entry will not have been confirmed. If you think you qualify for this competition and have not received an invitation to play or if you do not have access to emails, please contact me at the office or pick up a **WHITE** entry form from the bar.

The Newbies competition was so popular last year that many members who played or qualified last season have asked if they too can play. The short answer is **NO BUT**... we have introduced a second competition which we are calling the CLASS of 21/22 competition. This will be open to all members who joined the club during the 21/22 season i.e. between September 2021 and August 2022 or who qualified or played in last year's Newbies competition. Again, If you qualify for this competition, you will have already received an emailed invitation. Please complete the application form and submit it to the office with your £10 entrance fee. Entries are limited to just 32 players and will be allocated on a first come first PAID basis. If you have completed an entry form but not

yet paid, your entry will not have been confirmed. If you think you qualify for this competition and have not received an invitation to play or if you do not have access to emails, please contact me at the office or pick up a **GREEN** entry form from the bar. This competition will take the same format as the Newbies one and games will be awarded in accordance with the rules. As I always say, you have to be in it to win it so get your entries in as soon as possible.

All members, new and old, are welcome to enter their names to play in weekend friendlies. Details of the matches are posted on the Competitions Notice Board adjacent to the ladies changing rooms. Please only enter your name on the list if you are definitely available to play. The teams will be chosen by the Club Captains, Sonia and Ken during the week before each of the matches so please keep an eye on these match sheets to see if you have been picked to play.

We are also going to introduce a mixed Bowls Football Challenge Competition which will be open to all full members. This idea has been put together by our football fanatic, Brian Yershon and whilst it focuses on the fan base of Arsenal, West Ham, Spurs and the Orient, anyone can play. Once we have a date towards the end of the season, Brian and I will tidy up the rules and format of the competition and send out details to all members after Christmas.

Dress Code

There have been complaints that some members are not complying with the Club's dress code. There have been several emails about this so Members are again reminded that we do have a dress code here at Ilford:-

Men - Roll ups, internal competitions and internal leagues

- White shirts with collars or club shirts
- Grey trousers or shorts or club shorts or Bowls England approved colours
- White jumpers/cardigans/new club gilets/new club jackets
- Flat soled bowls shoes
- No jeans, vest tops, shirts without collars or hoodies
- No grey, black or blue jumpers or cardigans

Inter-club matches, friendlies and County Games unless otherwise advised

- White collared shirts or club shirts
- White trousers or shorts or club shorts or Bowls England approved colour
- White jumpers/cardigans/new club gilets/new club jackets
- Flat soles bowls shoes

Women - Roll ups, internal competitions and internal leagues

- White blouses with collars or club shirts
- Grey skirts or trousers or club shorts or Bowls England approved colour
- Navy blue jumpers/cardigans
- White new club gilets/new club jackets
- Flat soled bowls shoes
- No jeans, vest tops, shirts without collars or hoodies
- No grey, white, black or blue jumpers or cardigans

Unless you have a medical reason for not complying or permission from the Club Manager or a Director to play in other clothing or colours, PLEASE try to conform with this request. Reasonably priced Club shirts, gilets and jackets are on sale and available from the bar or office.

Competitions and leagues

Team Captains are reminded that it is their responsibility to select and ensure that ALL their team turn up for league matches. Nothing is more frustrating than the other team turns up only to find that their game cannot be played because the opposition cannot muster a full team or does not turn up at all. A full rink match can be played with 3 players or they can ask a player who does not have a match and is a spectator, to stand in as a substitute as long as that substitute is not registered to the opposing team, but the offending team will be deducted 25% of their score. Neither the Club nor the opposing team should be penalised for poor man management.

In the unlikely event that it can be proved that a team tactically uses this to gain an advantage in the league by fielding a much stronger player or to maintain a shot difference, the opposing team can lodge a complaint to the Club Manager and the offending team could have points deducted, be suspended for a number of matches or be disqualified completely from that league.

The Club arranges friendly interclub weekend matches through the season. These are usually well supported but if you want to be considered to play, you must enter your name on the Team Sheets situated on the Notice Board adjacent to the ladies changing rooms. Please do not put your name down if you cannot play. Teams will be chosen by the Club Captains usually by the Thursday prior to the game so please check that you are actually playing before coming to the club on the day.

The draw for the Club Championships has been made and the fixtures have been posted on the Main Notice Board in the playing area. The first named player or team (the Challenger) is responsible for arranging the date of the match which **MUST** be played by the date at the top of each round of the competition. There can be no exception to this rule. They must contact the opposition to arrange a convenient date and should give them 3 **reasonable** times and dates for the match to be played. They should also check the Club Diary which is situated on a table in the playing area adjacent to the bar. Only vacant rinks can be used so it is probably best to meet with the opposition and sort out an amicable and convenient date whilst at the Club. The Challenger should enter that date when agreed by all parties. It is also the Challenger's responsibility to arrange a marker in singles and fixed jack matches. If a player or team are unable to find a suitable date, the match will be awarded to the Challenger. 1001

Members are also reminded to check to see if there are any communications from the Club, their Team Captain or another member, awaiting for them in their mail box.

Health, Safety and Security (including Covid)

In the absence of our new Health and Safety Advisor Mr Bob Kane and Darrell Witek, AJ updated the team on the progress being made to update our existing H&S Policy. Work on this project is about 60% complete.

Report on Defibrillator training held on the 17th November.

This was a very successful and enjoyable course and attended by 17 of our members.

There are instructions on how the defibrillator works on the column next to it.

In an emergency, call for medical assistance ASAP and ask if any of the Defibrillator trainees are on the premises.

If there are no trained operatives on site, make sure you and the patient are safe and start CPR as soon as possible. If you use the Defibrillator, the machine itself will give you verbal and written instructions on what to do.

Bob Hayter purchased a gift for Lauren the trainer as a thank you to her giving up her time and expertise. This has been passed to Eric Gleave, her grandfather.

Thanks to the attendees who contributed to Lauren's gift which was matched by the club.

Maintenance reports

Bob Hayter advised that there will be a new monitor in playing hall to show the security cameras in operation around the premises.

New signs advising members that CCTV is in operation, have been placed around the club.

Tony Seago has put up new spotlights in the lounge and bar areas to improve the lighting in those areas. These can be controlled by an override switch.

Gardens and car park. - Report by Ian Treleaven

Ian has been keeping our gardens in pristine condition and cutting the grass and clearing leaves regularly. Our thanks for his help doing this.

AJ to write to Enid Tomlinson who planted several pots with flowers to enhance the entrance to the club.

Some of the lights in the playing area have failed but not enough to warrant changing all of the lighting. The club have purchased 15 light trays of which two have been used and the other held in stock in case of a unit failure.

Welfare

Report from SANDRA DUPUY on welfare matters.

Great to see that Gerry Quy, Eric Brown and Steve Simpson were at the meeting after stays in hospital for various reasons

Sandra Dupuy advised that Maureen Norgate's husband Peter was in hospital and she will send a card.

Bernie Chaplin, who himself has been unwell, was out with his wife who tripped and fell down an escalator and has broken her leg. Sandra to send a get well card.

Sandra will also send a card of condolence to the family of Filo Trelease who sadly passed away recently.

Bob advised that if any member wanted to attend the funeral on the 8th December at 10:30 am, please let him know so that he can pass numbers to Ted. Details of the funeral are on the notice board. AJ advised the team that due to Alex Macgowan's recent hospitalisation and a number of falls, he had regrettably had to temporarily suspend him for his own health's sake and to protect the club. Alex has had several spells in hospital and several falls, one of which resulted in him being taken back to hospital as an emergency. Jack Matthews advised that he has been in touch with Alex and Alex fully understands that this measure was taken in his interests.

Bob Hayter advised the Management Team that he has some health issues and he is working with his GP to resolve them. He does not want to cause alarm but there is a **possibility** that he will have a procedure in hospital and if so, he is likely to be off work for about 2 months.

Any other Business

As mentioned above, our accountants have warned us that we must offset some of our profits to avoid excessive Corporation Tax. As such Bob Hayter is obtaining quotes to upgrade our aging fire alarm system.

The new system will include better and more sirens/bells, 'strobe' lighting to warn visually impaired and hard of hearing members realise that there is an emergency and better signage.

Areas such as the changing rooms will be better served by the new alarm system. London Dial a Ride proposal

AJ advised that he is working with our member Steve Mathieson to provide help for members who are no longer able to drive to the club to enjoy bowls.

At the moment, this will only be available for any member living in a London Borough. The service is provided free of charge to those who qualify but there is a lengthy application process. Steve Mathieson and his wife have agreed to assist members to complete the forms and submit their applications.

AJ will conduct a survey of members to see if there is sufficient interest to take the matter forward.

The club do not receive benefit from doing this and are not financially linked to London Dial a Ride in any way.

Bar duties -

Eric Brown expressed concern over the lack of bar staff available particularly in the evenings and weekends. It was pointed out that Eric, Steve Simpson, Tony Seago and now Bob all have or have recently had medical problems which prevent them devoting as much time to running the bar as they would like. If more staff cannot be found to help the above members, Mo and Mark Newman, the bar will have to close for long periods causing a loss of income to the club and the loss of an important facility for the members. If you can help in any way, PLEASE put your name forward to be included on the bar rota.

Training will be given to any interested member.

Members will have noticed that the club have withdrawn the self-help tea and coffee facility in the kitchen. This is because unfortunately, not every member has put money into the honesty box to cover the cost of the tea, coffee and sugar used. This is unfortunate but the club cannot continue to make a loss on the supplies used. Tea is still available to buy from the bar.
