Welcome to the final Newsletter of the 22/23 season.

Our finals matches are now complete and the winners are listed below. However we just wanted to congratulate ALL of our competitors because reaching a final is no mean achievement. The standard of play was very high this year and there have been some upsets along the way which just goes to show that you have to be in it to win it.

This year we reintroduced the Championships for our woman members for the first time since 2011 and the response has been excellent with some excellent games and worthy winners. In fact the women's section has shown an increase in numbers since 2019. Whilst we have a large number of new male members, we have also lost a similar amount due to retirement from bowls, ill health or moving away from the area. Trying to keep our membership numbers up when many of our local clubs both indoors and out, have struggled to retain numbers, has been a challenge so overall, we are happy with the progress we have made.

We all have a duty and the opportunity to try to attract new members of different levels of experience. Yes we would love to have more County or National standard bowlers playing for us but it is equally important to encourage people who have never bowled before. These are the lifeblood of the club and the champions of the future so please encourage your friends and family to come along when we reopen in September and give it a go. We have several Qualified Coaches amongst our membership and even if they are not available, there are always experienced bowlers at the club who are able to give advice.

It would also be wonderful if we could attract some younger members? Unfortunately, bowls has the reputation of being 'an old persons' game and it's true that the average age of our membership is around 70 years. However, look at the World and National Champions and you will realise that many of them are in their 30's and 40's. These players started their careers as youngsters as young as 10 or 11 years old. The earlier they start the better they will be and there are plenty of opportunities to represent the County under 25's if they are good enough. If we can attract a group of young players, I'm sure we can arrange a taster session one evening so that they can get a taster of how enjoyable bowls is.

We have to congratulate Paul Whellams and Colin Foster for qualifying to represent Ilford in the National over 60's Pairs Competition in Nottingham. Paul is unfortunately leaving us in favour of Barking but we wish him luck whomever he settles with in the future.

Congratulations also to Karl Bunyan who is playing in the Essex Unbadged singles final at Falcon BC on the 15^{th} April. I'm sure you join me in wishing him the best of luck.

Congratulations also to Sandra Dupuy, Irene Powell and Bob Kane, for receiving their Essex County Badges. A lot of hard work and good bowling goes into this so they deserve the accolade and appreciation from their peers.

Moving away from the bowls side of the Club, we owe a debt of gratitude to all the members who have helped run the club in the 22/23 season. I will not name them all here because I'm sure to miss someone out but they include our Bar Team, the Maintenance Team, the Garden and Car park Team and the Management Team and Directors. I just have to mention two particular unsung heroes. Colin Foster who has been instrumental in setting up the TV Advertising system and supporting our aging computer system when it goes awry. Karl Bunyan who has already started work on our new website. It is not fully operational yet but we hope Karl will be able to get it up and running and ready for the new season in September. It is these 'behind the scenes' jobs which members can help us with. These members help save the club thousands of £££'s every year. I also include Mo and Bob in this list. Without their help, your fees would at least treble. However, we cannot expect these members to continue to work unaided so PLEASE, if you can help in any way, step forward to offer your time, help, experience and expertise. This is particularly important next season as Bob will be away for almost a month in February and I may also be forced to retire due to several ongoing health problems. If you can assist, please speak to Bob or I and we can try to introduce you to how the club is run.

We also need three more Directors to step forward. Our Constituent demands this and it is a legal requirement. The role of Director does come with a certain amount of responsibility but it's not a demanding role. It is up to the Directors to ensure that the Club is run properly and legally and to make important decisions on behalf of the membership. If you need more information about this, please contact our Chairman Sandy Dron.

Over the summer, we will be working with our Health and Safety Consultants, Croner. The H&S Policy will be rewritten specifically for the Club. The new policy will come into force in September.

We expect several important changes in policy particularly regarding placing the trolleys and congregating around the green between matches. It is an emotive subject and not an easy one to solve but solve it we must to ensure the safety of our members and staff. Please cooperate with the Management and observe the new regulations if and when they are introduced.

Another area we will be looking at next season is dress code. There are several different views on how people should be allowed to dress when playing bowls at Ilford. Many of the major bowls institutions have relaxed their dress codes. Gone are the days of playing in jackets, shirts and ties. However, nor do we want to start allowing players to play in jeans and vest tops. We hope we can find a happy medium. If we do make changes, we would ask every member to respect our codes and dress appropriately. The dress code for Interclub and County League Matches will remain the same and probably be more formal than club league matches are.

We hope you all enjoy the summer and we look forward to seeing you back at Ilford in September. The club will reopen on the 18^{th} September for rollups. There will be no charge for these during the first week of opening but we would appreciate a donation to this year's chosen charity Tracy's Trust.

This charity was set up by our members Marilyn and Stuart Nieman in memory of their daughter Tracy who sadly passed away from Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma at the age of 26. It falls under the umbrella of St Bartholomew's Hospital Charitable Trusts and supports research into Lymphoma and Leukaemia in children and young adults. A very worthy cause indeed and one which the Club is proud to support. I am hoping that Stuart or Marilyn will send through further details so that these can be published in this or in future additions of our Newsletters.

At this time of the season, it's right to spend a moment to remember those members past and present who have sadly passed away.

News from the Board Room

Summary of AGM 2nd April 2023

Matters arising

There are changes to Memorandum and Articles of Association. Details of the amendment to clause 21 have been sent to Bruce Allen for onward forwarding to Companies House.

Summary of Section Consolidation changes

These were set out in the Minutes of the AGM, attached to the Agenda.

Summary of Substitution Rule Changes

The following is a summary of the changes to the Substitution Rules agreed at the AGM. Bob Hayter will try to change the existing rules in the next handbook if room allows or will summarise them.

- As the Club operates an open League system which was agreed at the last AGM,
 there will be no change to the existing rule that prevents men playing in women's
 leagues and vice versa. The rule agreed at the Ladies Section Meeting to prevent
 men playing in ladies leagues goes against agreed Club policy.
- Teams will be permitted to ask a full member present at the Club, to stand in as a substitute if they are a player short.
- That player cannot play against his own team in the same league.
- That player cannot leave his own team, under any circumstances, to play for another team in the same league thus leaving them with the need to find a substitute.
- If more than one player is available to act as a substitute, the player must be chosen by the toss of a coin. The team needing the substitute cannot select the player of their choice in these circumstances.
- The substitute can only play in position 2 in a full rink match or as lead in a triples match.
- Only one substitute is allowed per team.
- If a full rink team is still a player short, 25% of their score will be deducted from their total and any substitutes can only play as lead.

The proposal that the Directors with approval of the Management Team, can increase green fees without the need or an AGM or EGM, in exceptional circumstances, was passed at the AGM.

Club Charity Details

Tracy's Trust was chosen by a vote at the AGM. AJ to ask Stuart Nieman to prepare a summary setting out why the charity was formed and why members should support it.

Membership Reports

Latest Membership count - Bob Hayter reported that we now have 69 women members, 199

men and 21 Social members totalling 289 in all.

The membership count in 2019/20 was 57 women and 199 men.

Staffing report from Bob Hayter

Bob Hayter reported that Alan Bayliss had joined the bar team and was undergoing training.

Eric Brown has now moved home and is no longer local to the club. Whilst he will continue to help, alternative arrangements for locking up in the evenings and at weekends, must be addressed when the Club reopens.

When the new season commences, Bob will prepare a rota of volunteers so that the bar and club are covered at most times.

Further approaches to the members to be made to try to get another bar helper for the 23/24 season.

Bob Hayter reminder those present that he will be away in New Zealand in February 2024 and any clerical help we can get would be most appreciated.

Events, Fundraising, Sponsorship, Publicity and Charity

Race Night - 11th March 2023 at 7:00pm

The race night on the 11th March was a real success and raised £1000 plus bar takings.

Thanks to all those who helped on the night, particularly those guests who worked on the tote.

A letter of thanks has been sent to Cheryl Petar and a small gift of thanks for all her efforts in setting this event up.

Some lessons were learnt with regard seating arrangements but if we hold an event like this again, we should be better placed to ensure that everyone can see and easily participate in the fun.

Thanks also to Colin Foster who managed to connect the Race Screen to the TV(s) in the lounge so that more people can see the races in progress.

No other events have been planned for this season.

Leagues and Match Reports

Bob Hayter reminded members that the Finals will be played from the 11th April 2023.

The results will be distributed to members after the last final has been played.

Bob Hayter advised that the Club would reopen for roll ups during week commencing 18th September 2023. These would be free of charge for that week only but a donation to the Club's charity, Tracy's Trust, would be welcomed.

AJ asked if the Club should have a public open day but there was no appetite for arranging this.

Report on teams in the leagues

There were only a few outstanding league matches and these will be played week commencing 10th April 2023.

The presentations will take place after the finals have finished.

Markers have been arranged for matches as needed and Wendy Gray will be asked to mark the women's singles final.

Bob Hayter reminded the team that this will be the first Ladies Singles final since 2011. All the women's competitions have been well supported and we thank all those women and gents who have entered.

Friendly matches report

Sonia McDonald gave her thanks to all the members who supported the weekend friendly games and supported the club. Thanks were given to Sonia, Ken and indeed all the Bowls Team for their efforts in choosing the squads and arranging the games.

Sonia welcomed our new ladies vice-captain Bernice Gilbert who we hope will support Sonia next season and help with the weekend friendlies.

Inside Outside League

We are still one team short for the Inside Outside League.

Brian Yershon's proposed Bowls Football Supporters Competition

This has been put on hold until the new season and will depend on having an acceptable date available.

Club pens and score cards

New pens are on order and will be available at the start of next season.

New score cards are also on order.

Health, Safety and Security (including Covid)

As advised at last meeting, Croner Health & Safety Consultants have now been contracted to look after our Health & Safety policy and requirements for the next 4 years.

Initial basic computer training on their computerised HR and H&S systems has already been given to Bob Hayter and Alan Jaye. It was decided not to train Darrell Witek and Bob Kane until the policy has been tailored to the Club's specific needs.

A full day of evaluation with a consultant has been arranged for 7th August 2023 starting at 09:00 am

Alan Jaye, Bob Hayter, Bob Kane and Darrell Witek (the Health & Safety Committee) will be asked to be present on that day as the consultant will survey the Club and assess our particular needs and weaknesses.

Vince Allen asked if he could help in any way and will also be invited to join the H&S Committee and attend on the 7th August 2023.

The new H&S Policy should be in place by the time the Club reopens in September 2023.

This work is very challenging and there are many legal implications that have to be addressed. Every member has a duty of care to comply with the new regulations for their own safety and that of every member of staff, member and visitor to the Club.

The Local Authority and H&S Executive can visit the Club at any time and have the legal power to close us down if we do not comply with all the regulations.

Safeguarding

Croner will also be asked to look at our existing Safeguarding policy and make changes where necessary. This is another area the club have to take seriously. We have a legal obligation to ensure we have trained Safeguarding Officers available to protect the safety and welfare of all our members and visitors.

Sandra Dupuy who is our Safeguarding Director has suggested she may have to stand down from this role as she is now involved in coaching. If she does this, another member will need to step up to take over responsibility for Safeguarding and if no one steps forward, this might also have to be outsourced.

Safeguarding documents received from Ken Spicer, have been forwarded to Croner for consideration.

AJ also asked Croner to consult with Bowls England to see what their safeguarding policy contains.

Bob Hayter advised that the fire alarm system would be upgraded in the closed season, subject to agreeing the costs.

More stringent fire alarm testing will need to be carried out throughout the season and if an alarm sounds, members and Staff MUST comply and leave the building if so advised to do by any appointed fire officer. This is not a joke, lives could be at stake if people do not comply.

It was suggested by Tony Seago and agreed that as Bob cannot be at the Club 24/7, anyone running the bar should automatically be appointed the acting Fire Officer on the day. Necessary training will be given.

There are at least two major issues that the club will have to address when it reopens in September.

Bowls trolleys

These can be a tripping hazard and hanging them over the handrails is no longer acceptable or advised.

Tony Seago is looking into either providing more trolley hooks or making a trolley posts so that the trolleys can be placed in a safer area.

Tony also suggested that we reintroduce a Trolley Park Area so that they can be placed safely. Any other ideas on this would be welcome.

The areas between the lounge and the green.

Despite our best efforts, members entering the playing area before the previous matches have ended has continued to be a problem as is leaving their bowls on the tables or next to the green when the previous matches have not finished.

Several ideas have been put forward including moving the tables back against the lounge wall thus giving more space to players leaving the green. These will be discussed at the next meeting and may be trialled.

In the meantime, PLEASE remain in the lounge until players in the previous matches have left the green.

Likewise, players leaving the green should collect their belongings and retire to the changing rooms as quickly as possible to change.

These issues will be discussed with Croner when we meet in August.

Maintenance reports

No major work carried out since the last meeting.

The installation of monitors in the playing area is ongoing and yet to be resolved. Colin Foster is working to resolve this problem.

Gardens and car park. - Report by Ian Treleaven

Ian was not present at the meeting but thanks were given to him in his absence for continuing to keep the gardens in excellent condition.

The wooden fence and fence posts adjacent to the building were damaged in an unfortunate accident, by one of our members. Tony Seago has agreed to carry out the necessary repairs over the summer. The cost of these repairs will be passed on to the member concerned.

Tony Seago asked if it was necessary to re-paint the white lines in the car park. Bob Hayter advised that as the car park is being used by 12 to 15 year olds for Air Corps training in the summer, this job should be withheld for a further year.

AJ asked Tony Seago if it was possible to fill in some of the potholes in the car park and Tony agreed to do this for the Club.

The Air Corps are aware of the potholes and have agreed to sweep the car park to remove gravel and loose stones as part of their thanks for us letting them use our facilities.

It was suggested that the Air Corps youngsters be invited to try out indoor bowls when the season recommences.

AJ to contact the Local Council regarding the potholes in the access road. This is an unadopted road and when this was bought up last time, the Council refused to carry out repairs. The club footed the bill for almost £2,000 although through perseverance, some of that expense was eventually recovered from the Council.

Bob Hayter advised that estimates to replace our fire alarm system have been received and the work will be carried out in the summer at a cost of approximately £9.5k.

Any detailed quotes received, should be forwarded to Croner Health and Safety for approval of protection provided.

Bob Hayter also advised that the door entry system was not working due to a power problem. As we are out of contract with Bassons, Essex Security Systems have been asked if they can resolve the problem. Bob Hayter is meeting with them on the 14th April.

It is possible that the system might need replacing and this is something Bob will be discussing with Essex Security.

He will also be discussing our aging alarm system which was installed in 1986. There have been several false alarms over the past few weeks and this too might have to be replaced.

It was noted that when the alarm went off, not one person made an attempt to leave the building. This must be addressed when fire drills are introduced.

The TV Advertising computer ceased working and Colin Foster has replaced this with an internet based system which can be controlled remotely. It is also much easier to use and notices can be added and taken off in minutes from within the club or online.

Sincere thanks to Colin Foster who has spent many hours working to get the system operational. CAN THE BAR TEAM PLEASE ENSURE THAT THE ADVERTISING TV IS TURNED ON, ON ARRIVAL AT THE CLUB AND THAT THE LAST MAN/WOMAN OUT TURNS IT OFF.

Members are encouraged to look at the notices and take heed as some are quite important.

Karl Bunyan has started work on the Club's website. No updates have been received as yet. We do need to get the website operational early in the next season and Bob Hayter to speak to Karl about this in the closed season.

Thanks to Karl for the work he has carried out so far.

Sandy Dron expressed thanks again to all the maintenance team who continue to save the club hundreds of £££'s every year.

Welfare

Report from SANDRA DUPUY on welfare matters.

Get well messages have been sent to Marion Bond who is recovering from surgery.

Sandra reported some good news that Carol Tresadern was in remission and was doing quite well in her recovery. The MT sent our best wishes to Carol and hope to see her back at the club very soon.

It was reported that our new member Stanley Barclay had had a fall. Sandra to send a get well card.

It was also reported that Alan Moss was in hospital undergoing tests. Best wishes were sent to him for a speedy recovery but thankfully, he was well enough to attend the finals day.

AJ reminded the MT that only one person has shown any interest in helping administer the Club. With Bob away next February and Alan suffering with a few health problems, it is essential that members step forward to help to avoid unnecessary closures and disruption to the leagues and matches.

AJ is prepared to train up anyone who would like to be considered for any job and will support that person as required.

The Constitution demands that we need 12 Directors, we have only 9. New Directors are urgently needed to run the Club. Please speak to Alan or Bob if even slightly interested.

Bob Hayter advised that 6 people have a chance of winning the latest lottery. If not won this week, it will be paid out when the Club reopens.
