

Newsletter 30 – October 2023

Welcome to or back to Ilford & District Indoor Bowls Club Ltd (IIBC) and our first Newsletter of the 2023/2024 season.

At the time of writing, we are delighted to advise that we already have taken on 30 new or returning members, many of whom are much needed women members who we hope will strengthen this section of the club. We extend a warm welcome to you all and hope that you enjoy playing and socialising here at Ilford. I invite you to read this Newsletter as it contains information about the Club which, as new members you need to know.

There are many opportunities to play in our leagues and friendly matches regardless of your ability. If you haven't done so already, please add your name to the availability lists which can be found either in the playing area or at the bar and one of our team captains will contact you if they have spaces in their teams.

If you are new to the club, we do offer guidance by arrangement with our Club Manager Bob Hayter. Initial sessions are free of charge but there will be a small charge, payable to our charity, if you require further lessons. If you are not ready for our leagues, there are plenty of times available for roll-ups (practice sessions) but please refer to our handbook as matches take priority over roll-ups. We all have to start somewhere so don't be embarrassed if you have a bad game, practice makes perfect.

Coaching, guidance and etiquette

The Club is aware that we only have a few members who are also qualified coaches. We are looking at ways to encourage members to embark on the various Coach England Courses but this will take time and commitment. The courses are not easy but they are rewarding. If you are interested, please speak to a member of the Management Team who will be able to point you in the right direction. There is nothing wrong with an experienced bowler offering guidance and advice to a new bowler but please be aware that a non-qualified coach/trainer, is not insured and if, in the unlikely event of an accident happening in the course of a training/guidance session, neither the trainer or the Club would be covered. Trainees are therefore advised that they undergo training or guidance at their own risk. Trainers should also point this out to the trainee if and when they begin a training session.

Bowls training is not just about teaching a player how to deliver a bowl. There are a lot of rules and regulations to learn about, how to behave on and off the green, where to stand, who does the measuring, when to and not to

speak whilst on the green and so on. They may seem irrelevant but they are all designed to make the game more enjoyable. To help new (and old) members learn and understand the etiquette of bowls, the Club have formed a panel of experienced bowlers who will explain what you can and cannot do. The panel consists of Mark Newman, Darrell Witek, Karl Bunyan, Bernice Gilbert and Sandra Dupuy assisted by Steve Simpson and Alan Bayliss. These members are putting together a short training course and when ready, we will ask ALL new members to attend at least one of the Etiquette/Rules sessions. In future, this will become part of the membership requirements regardless of whether you are completely new to bowls or an experienced bowler. Even if you are in the latter category, our rules might differ to those of your outdoor or other club so please attend as soon as you can.

With so many new members, one particular example of etiquette violations occurs time and time again. We ask all members AGAIN, to respect games in progress on the green. PLEASE do not congregate at the back of the green whilst waiting to play. Unless you are just watching a game, please stay in the lounge until the session bell sounds and even then, wait at the back of the green until the players have left the green and collected their bowls and belongings. To players finishing a match, please leave the green and collect your belongings as quickly as possible, moving to the lounge or changing rooms to exchange niceties, handshakes and words of congratulations or commiserations. Thank you in anticipation of your cooperation.

To conclude this section, whilst our Club is regarded as one of the friendliest in the area, everyone is reminded that verbal, psychological or physical abuse and unacceptable racial, sexual, homophobic or religious behaviour will not be tolerated. The Club take this very seriously and will take appropriate action to deal with the perpetrator(s). What is a casual comment or remark to you, might be taken as offensive to others, so please be careful how you treat fellow members, Club Officers and staff. If you have an issue with another member, please report this to the Club Manager, Bob Hayter or any member of the Board of Directors. They will take any action which is appropriate.

Dress Code, Electric Vehicle and Football Bowls surveys.

The club uses a program called Mailchimp to survey the members on subjects which do or could be of interest to them or the Club. These surveys are conducted in private and the results shared only with the Management Team. At the moment we have two ongoing surveys:-

1. Dress Code

a. Despite most clubs having a dress code of sorts, OUR policy has been challenged and as such, we have taken the decision to review the existing dress code. You will have already received a Dress Code Survey by email which askes the basic question, do you think the Club should have a dress code or not. Also included in the survey was a draft proposal of our preferences and expectations. Copies of this are also displayed on the notice boards. Members were invited to comment on the code and make recommendations in writing on how it can be improved. All suggestions should be sent to me at Secretary@iibc.uk and when the survey closes at the end of October, I will summarise the suggestions and will make further amendments as the Directors and I feel appropriate. I know not everyone will approve of the dress code even when changes

have been made, but I would ask you to help maintain the Club's high standards and dress in accordance with the Dress Code, whilst playing.

2. Electric Vehicles

a. With the growing number of electric vehicles in circulation, the Club are considering installing one or two electric charging points in the car park. The Electric Vehicle survey asks how many of you own or intend to own an electric vehicle in the next few months and whether you would use one of our charging points if we had them? There is no guarantee that we will install pods. Much will depend on the demand and the cost of installation. I am also told that the large fuel companies such as Shell and BP, are developing alternative fuels which are much greener and less damaging to the environment. This too could affect our decision. If anyone has any official information about this, we would be pleased to hear it.

We will be sending out a further survey in the next few weeks relating to a proposed fun Charity Football Bowls Competition, suggested by soccer mad Arsenal fan, Brian Yershon. We are working on the logistics at the moment but very briefly, competitors will play in a team representing one of our London Football Clubs. Arsenal, Leyton Orient, Spurs and West Ham have been suggested but that is not set in stone. Each team will play a round robin competition against the others, playing for the 'Brian Yershon Football Trophy' (just a suggestion, sponsors required please) and bragging rights. It will be open to men and women and you do not have to support the club you agree to play for. Football shirts would be acceptable for this competition but not obligatory. If you are interested, please wait for the survey so that we can manage the replies automatically or contact Brian for further information. Yershon@aol.com.

If you have not already completed your Dress Code or Electric Vehicle surveys and submitted them, please do so as soon as possible. Each survey has a closing date and the results are automatically processed by Mailchimp. All you have to do is to answer a few simple questions and hit the submit button, Simples!

- 1. Apologies Received See above
- 2. Matters arising from meeting held on the 11th April 2023
 - a. There were no matters arising
- 3. New Team Members
 - a. A warm welcome was given to our new team members, Ian Dunn, Karl Bunyan and Vince Allen.

4. Membership Reports

- a. Latest Membership count Bob Hayter reported that we now have 78 (69) women members, 219 (199) men and 20 (21) Social members totalling 317 in all.
- b. Bob Hayter indicated that checking the list, it was probable that 14 existing members would not renew in January for a variety of reasons.

5. Financial and Staffing Reports

a. Bob Hayter reported that we have healthy bank and savings account balances but warned about complacency. Without this reserve of funds and careful financial management, the club would overspend by at least £5,000 a year.

- b. We have already received our first interest payment of circa £550 which appears to be paid 3 or 4 monthly.
- c. Sandy Dron again thanked Alan for all his hard work setting up the savings account with Virgin Money and raising almost £100,000 since becoming General Secretary.

6. Staffing report from Bob Hayter

- a. Bob Hayter reported that Alan Bayliss had joined Tony Seago, Mark Newman, Eric Brown, Steve Simpson and of course our lovely Mo on the bar team.
- b. It was proposed to stop selling draft bitter in the bar as it was no longer in demand nor profitable. Bottled bitter will be available instead.

7. Events, Fundraising, Sponsorship, Publicity and Charity

- a. Quiz Night
 - i. Bob Hayter is arranging one of his legendary quiz nights for the 18th November 2023.
 - ii. Posters will go up in the next few days advertising the event and giving details.
 - iii. Past quizzes have sold out almost immediately so anyone interested should put their names down and pay quickly as tickets will be sold on a first come first served basis.
 - iv. The evening will include a fish and chip supper and will cost in the region of £15 per person. Final price to be agreed as the price of fish and chips has risen so sharply.
- b. There will be a private family 90th birthday party for Phil Beverton at the club.
- c. Lottery New members welcome once the current game has finished (possibly 25th November). Please ask Mo at the bar for further details. If you still owe for this game, please settle up as soon as possible.
 - i. The last lottery was won by Maggie Smith who collected £725 in winnings.
- d. Our Target Bowls Competition will resume at Christmas, subject to enough interest from the members.
- e. Ilford will host a Potters Road show on the 14th November from 11:00 am until approximately 18:00. Ian Dunn to finalise the arrangements with Potters and to make parking space available on the day.
- f. Charity Tracy's Trust supporting children with Lymphoma and Leukaemia
 - i. On the first week of opening, we did not charge green fees but we asked all bowlers to make a donation to the Club's chosen charity. The appeal raised £200 for this wonderful cause.
- g. Sponsorship
 - i. Several new sponsors supported the Club's handbook this year and in total we raised £1200 which will pay for the cost of printing and the balance go towards the Gala Day arrangements.
 - ii. We also have generous new sponsors for some of the Club's competitions. Pat Brown and Sonia McDonald have agreed to sponsor a Ladies Pairs competition and Dennis Tuerena, the Open (mixed) Consolation Pairs competition, subject to sufficient interest.
 - iii. Bob Hayter to arrange the trophies.
- h. Thanks to Bob, Mark Banning and Dennis Tuerena, Lexus have agreed to extend their sponsorship for another year. Lexus cars will be on show at the Gala day should you be interested in purchasing a Lexus or Toyota car.

- i. Sincere thanks to all the clubs sponsors and those instrumental in finding these supporters.
- j. Advertising
 - i. The Club do not do much external advertising but at Alan Jaye's request, an advertising budget of £1500 has been agreed should this be needed.
- k. No other events have been planned for this season.

8. Gala Day - Saturday 10th February 2024

- a. Our major event of the season, and our biggest fund-raiser, our Gala, will be held on the 10^{th} February 2024 and we would appreciate as much help on the day from the Management Team and the members. Please anote your diaries accordingly.
- b. Guest of Honour
 - i. Several suggestions as to who should be our guest of honour were discussed. It was generally felt that the guest should be a currently well-known personality or sportsperson if someone could be found. However, after much consideration, it was decided to invite the Head Teacher of Oaks Park School next door along with her Head Boy and Head Girl. Showing these guests what we do and introducing youngsters to bowls could be a way of attracting younger members?
 - ii. AJ to send an invitation.
- c. Bowls Wear Direct have agreed to attend as our appointed bowls wear suppliers.
- d. Lexus, our sponsors, will attend with two cars on show.
- e. Pat Brown and her team have agreed to organise the raffle, tombola and white elephant table.
- f. Members to be asked to bring their donations of gifts for the raffle/tombola or White Elephant to the club BUT not before Christmas please.
- g. Volunteers will be needed on the day to staff the car parks, tidy up, help the caterer, meet and greet the players, our members and guests and a variety of other essential duties. A list will be put up in the club, nearer to the event.
- h. Catering to be discussed at next meeting.
- i. Bob to invite last year's clubs to participate.

9. Leagues and Match Reports

- a. It is very early season so not much to report. There were one or two initial glitches but these have been sorted out.
- b. There is a list at the bar for any members who wish to join one of our leagues. Please enter your name if you are interested and one of our team captains will be in touch, subject to availability. Ten players have already been placed.
- c. Newbies Competition
 - i. As we have already got 29 new members, we will be holding another Newbies Competition in 2024. Work on the format and who can enter will be started before Christmas. Further information to follow.
 - ii. A Class of 22/23 competition is a matter for discussion. This would be open to last year's new members. AJ to gauge the interest. A notice will go up in due course.
- d. Football Bowls Charity Completion
 - i. Brian Yershon is still keen to introduce a new fun Charity Football Bowls Competition. The basic idea is to get 8 teams of full members who will represent 4 London Football clubs. Arsenal, Leyton Orient, Spurs and West Ham have been suggested but other clubs can be included.

ii. The competition will take place on a Wednesday at 4:30 pm on a date yet to be agreed.

e. Club Friendly Fixtures

- i. Harry Musaphia was not present at the meeting but asked me to advise that a friendly game with Loughton had been arranged.
- ii. Sonia McDonald advised that the match against Hainault went well.
- iii. Some of the dates of other matches have been changed so members should check the notice board accordingly.
- iv. Members are asked to place the mat back on the green at the end of their match, not just throw it on to the surrounds, and move the tables back into their normal position.
- v. Please help with washing and tidying up after your game. Do not leave the club in an untidy state for someone else to clear up and do not leave it all to Sonia.

f. County League and Over 60's

- i. Pat Brown the Ladies County League Secretary had nothing to report this early in the season.
- g. County Delegates Report Bob Kane
 - i. Bob Kane gave a brief report on a recent meeting of the ECIBA. I have since sent out his report to all MT members.
 - ii. There was a discussion on how to get on the County roll which is much more difficult now that the women and gents divisions have been combined. Full details can be found on page 80 of the Essex County Handbook.
 - iii. Disappointingly, of our 7 unbadged players only 2 have been allocated games.

10. Coaching and Etiquette

- a. The club is aware of our lack of qualified coaches. We do have some level 1 coaches in the membership but no level 2 coaches and that could cause problems.
- b. There is nothing to stop any member showing another member the basics but the club is not insured should there be an accident so any training must be done at the trainee's risk.
- c. Coaching, guidance and training can be carried out at the club on a Wednesday afternoon subject to rink availability and by arrangement.
- d. ALL members new and old should be aware of basic bowls etiquette and as such, Mark Newman, Darrell Witek, Alan Bayliss, Karl Bunyan, Steve Simpson Bernice Gilbert and Sandra Dupuy, have agreed to form an Etiquette Committee which can be held on or off the green.
 - i. All new members will be required to attend one of these courses where they will learn the etiquette of bowls rather than just how to play. Knowing what to do on and off the green is an important part of the game.
 - ii. Please watch out for further details of these sessions.

11. Health, Safety & Security

- a. The new H&S Team comprising of Bob Hayter, Alan Jaye, Bob Kane, Ian Dunn, Darrell Witek, Ian Treleaven and Vince Allen seem to be settling into the role and have been shown the basics of how our new H&S computerised system works. They will continue to develop skills during the season. They also have the contact details of Kevin Towler, the Croner representative if they run into problems.
- b. If you have an accident at the Club or on its premises, you must report it to a member of the H&S Team who will fill in the appropriate form.

- c. Ian Dunn, Vince Allen and Bob Hayter have carried out their first risk assessments and have implemented changes where needed.
- d. Further risk assessments will be done on a monthly basis.
- e. A copy of the full H&S Policy is available to inspect by arrangement with Alan Jaye when in the office.
- f. Bob Kane carried out a risk assessment of the bar store area.
- g. The fire alarm was tested and will be tested again throughout the season. Players will be warned in advance but will be expected to evacuate so that the H&S Team know what to do in a real emergency. All members are asked to cooperate.
- h. Sandra Dupuy asked if there was an emergency light that flashes if the fire alarm goes off. The people who carried out our Fire Risk Assessment advised this would not be a requirement.
- i. Sandra Dupuy to look into Safeguarding for Coaches. There might be information available on the Brightsafe H&S System?

12. IIBC Website

- a. Karl Bunyan advised that our new website was now up and running. He advised that it is quite easy to maintain and he will explain how it works to Ian Dunn, Alan and Bob when time permits.

13. Maintenance

- a. Most of the planned maintenance work has been completed.
- b. Bob Hayter asked for volunteers to help clear the moss from the pathways and gutters surrounding the Club.
- c. Some potholes have been repaired but the ones outside the entrance to the club, are not our responsibility.
- d. The only way to solve the potholes reappearing is to resurface the entire car park and that would be an expensive job.
- e. The question of Electric Charging points was raised.
 - i. Alan Jaye will survey the members to see how many have electric cars and the need to install points.
 - ii. In the meantime, Ian Dunn will obtain quotes for installation and look into grants.
 - iii. It should be remembered that for every electric point installed we lose a normal car parking space.
 - iv. Members are requested to park considerately between and not across the white lines.
- f. Thanks to Tony Seago for installing the new trolley safety rails. The remaining unpainted rails will be painted at the end of the season.
- g. The garden are being kept in good order thanks to the efforts of Ian Treleaven.

14. Welfare

a. There was little to report in this section but is was noted that Ian Robertson, Collin Mully, Alan Moss, Mike Carson, Hugh Adams and Alex MacGowan had all had spells in hospital. We wish them all a speedy recovery back to good health.

b. If you know of anyone else who is suffering ill health or has been hospitalised, Please let Sandra know.

15. Any other business

- a. Due to a deterioration of dress standards, the Club decided to enforce our dress code rules more rigorously and several members were asked to dress appropriately. Most complied but one member in particular has taken offence to our code and has challenged the club to either abolish it completely or relax the rules. The Directors and Management Team in its entirety felt that the Club should have a dress code in line with almost every other club in the area. However it was agreed to carry out a survey of ALL members seeking their views.
- **b**. There is no doubt the rules as they appear in the Handbook are not clear enough and are open to misinterpretation. As such Bob Hayter and Alan Jaye have revised the existing code and will place a copy of the new recommendations on the two main notice boards.
- c. AJ will carry out a short Mailchimp survey of all members to see if a dress code is acceptable. This will be sent out with a copy of the proposed code as at the 10^{th} October 2023.
- d. Members will also be asked for suggestions on how the dress code can be improved if that is the will of the majority of members. Suggestions should be emailed to Secretary@iibc.UK All sensible comments and suggestions will be considered and amendments made if appropriate
- e. In the meantime, the Management Team would ask ALL members to comply with its recommendations as can be seen on the notice boards.
- f. Any member not complying may politely be asked to leave the green.
- g. Not every member will agree with our final version but if the majority of members vote in favour, we would ask you all to comply and we thank you in anticipation of your cooperation in this delicate matter.
- h. Proposal put forwards by Jack Matthews that next season the Sunday League matches will be reduced to 2 hour games.
