It has been a very successful start to our 2023/2024 season and we are pleased to welcome 42 new or returning members, to date with several more interested in joining in the next few weeks or at the beginning of 2024. Welcome to you all. As new members, we lovingly call you **NEWBIES**, you qualify for our Newbies Competition which will be held on **Wednesday 27**th **March 2024** starting at 12:30. This is serious but fun competition, open to all members who have joined the club in 2023 regardless of their ability. The way the competition is cleverly structured (thanks to Bob Hayter), is that players play in different playing positions and with different players in each match so there is a mix of raw beginners and experienced members playing with and against you. You accumulate points in each game which you carry to your next game and the player with the most points, wins our new trophy kindly donated by Bob Kane and which will be presented to the winning Newbie at our prize giving on the 12th April 2024. If you are eligible you should have already received an invitation to play but if you have only just joined or feel that you should be included, please contact me (Alan Jaye) and I will add you to the list. We can only accept the first 32 players as that is our maximum rink capacity so if you haven't already signed up and paid, you need to do this NOW to avoid disappointment.

So successful are these competitions that last year's NEWBIES ask why can't we can have a competition for them as well? As such we have arranged a *CLASS* of 21/22 Competition just for you. This takes the same format as the Newbies but is only open to members who joined in 2022, last year's Newbies. This competition will be held on **Wednesday the 3rd April 2024**. Again, you should already have received an invitation and again, interest is fierce. So sign up at the bar to secure your place.

Having enrolled all these wonderful new members has in fact caused us a bit of a problem. Obviously, they want to come to as many roll ups as possible. How else can they practice? Most times there is no problem with rink availability BUT at 12:30 pm on Tuesdays and Fridays, our busiest days, they struggle to find a rink to practice or roll up on. Priority has to be given to County League and County Matches and we have an ongoing commitment with the NHS who take one rink on Tuesdays. What happens at this time of the year is that members are arranging their Championship games on or during that 12:30 spot. The Club has therefore reluctantly decided that:-

NO CLUB COMPETITIONS CAN BE PLAYED AT 12:30PM on Tuesdays or Fridays.

We do not want to discourage new bowlers from rolling up or practicing and it is financially beneficial for the club to maximise rink availability. If you have already booked that slot for your match, **please try to rearrange** it

Whilst our Handbook shows which rinks are available throughout the season, as this goes to print in August some of the spaces shown as vacant, are subsequently taken up with other matches so ALL members should therefore check the BOWLS DIARY which is situated on a table on the greenside of the bar adjacent to rink 1 and also the dry wipe board to the right of the green adjacent to rink 4. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

It has be noticed that some members or visitors are wearing ordinary trainers on the green. Only flat soled shoes/trainers with no tread, or bowls approved shoes, are allowed. The green is our biggest asset and any shoe with a tread damages the surface. Likewise, please do not wear your bowls shoes outside of the Club or come to the club wearing your bowls shoes as you could bring in oil, grease and dirt which again can damage the green. We had an incident only last week when we found a large area of chewing gum stuck to the carpet. This was obviously stuck the sole of someone's shoe. So please be careful and change into your bowls shoes in the changing room.

Raffles and Draws

Our first free membership raffle starts on Monday 27th November. For just £1, you could win a year's FREE membership. Depending on the response from our members, we hope to hold 3 of these raffles but as usual, YOU HAVE TO BE IN IT TO WIN IT, Please buy your tickets at the bar.

We also hold a Christmas Raffle which will start in December. If you would like to donate **new good quality** prizes or vouchers, please bring them to the Club as soon as possible for Bob's attention. This is nothing to do with the Gala Raffle, Tombola or White Elephant Table so any donations for the GALA event should not be bought to the Club until after Christmas please.`

Coaching, guidance and etiquette

There was an indifferent response to our proposed Etiquette Sessions. Only 3 members registered and received the necessary training. The Etiquette Team who now wish to be called the **TRAINING** Team, gave up several valuable hours putting together a comprehensive and enjoyable program which all members, new and old, would benefit from. They addressed most if not all of the bad habits we have all fallen in to over the years. Whilst we pride ourselves on being the friendliest club around and in fact we encourage friendly banter, we must not lose sight of the fact that we are predominantly a bowls club and some members and certainly members from visiting Clubs, do take the game **very** seriously. Some of the behaviour on the greens would be considered unacceptable elsewhere so all we ask is for you to consider other players and keep the banter and friendly chats on and off the green, under control. It might be because of this that we possibly do not perform as well in County or important matches as we should, because serious players demand better behaviour around them to help them concentrate on the game? Everyone, me included, should put their names down for a 1 hour session which will only benefit them and the Club going forward.

From the beginning of next season this will be obligatory for anyone joining the Club. In the meantime, please support the team and contact one of the following team members if you are interested.

There has been quite a lot of interest from members wishing to embark on marking and coaching courses. Ian has made enquiries about the availability of these courses which are in high demand. He has found a bowls

approved marker who is willing to come to the Club to carry out the necessary training. Our problem again, is rink availability during the season. Ian and I will be discussing this with Bob over the coming days to assess the feasibility of holding a course at Ilford. We would love to hold one here but we might not be able to fit one in. Coaching courses are a lot more difficult to find. The ones held at Falcon IBC in Chelmsford are pretty much booked up until April. Coaching courses are held over 4 days. Two days the coaching is carried out over Zoom and the other two days at Falcon. If Ian can negotiate a sensible price, the Club might consider sponsoring two members if there is any interest. Once we know exactly where we stand on both types of courses, we will survey the members to find out who are interested. Watch this space for further information.

We do have some members who are already qualified coaches so anyone interested should contact the office for contact details. The Club will continue to offer basic training to any member who is interested. This will be carried out by our more experienced bowlers but as they are not insured for mishaps, training will be at the trainees own risk.

To conclude this section, whilst our Club is regarded as one of the friendliest in the area, everyone is reminded that verbal, psychological or physical abuse and unacceptable racial, sexual, homophobic or religious behaviour will not be tolerated. The Club take this very seriously and will take appropriate action to deal with the perpetrator(s). What is a casual comment or remark to you, might be taken as offensive to others, so please be careful how you treat fellow members, Club Officers and staff. If you have an issue with another member, please report this to the Club Manager, Bob Hayter or any member of the Board of Directors. They will take any action which is appropriate.

Dress Code

Many hours have been spend by the Management Team and myself to address the objections to our existing dress code. This initially resulted in us conducting a Mailchimp Survey to all members with an email address.

The deadline for the dress code survey expired on the 31st October and there have been no further responses.

The results of the survey were as follows:-

Of the 121 responses, 114 were in favour of us having a dress code and just 7 against. However, quite a few other members made some sensible suggestions on how the code could be improved to appease all.

I have analysed and re-analysed those replies received and have made final revisions to the dress code policy as promised, incorporating as many of the suggestions as possible. The replies received fell into two main categories. What would be considered acceptable clothing and what colours should be allowed.

Based on these assumptions and after much discussion with Bob, the Management Team unanimously approved the latest proposals which will now be accepted as the Club's dress code. Full details have already been emailed to all members and posted on both notice boards. We know not everyone will be satisfied with the outcome but we hope that all will comply with the results and adhere to the policy we have approved.

Quiz Night

Many thanks to Bob and Sandra Hayter for putting on another epic quiz. We raised an awesome sum of money for this year's charity Tracy's Trust and the evening was enjoyed by all.

However, Bob expressed concerns over the lack of committee members present and the lack of help he received in setting up and clearing up the Club. If future quizzes are not better supported by the Management Team and the members, this may well be the end of this traditional and successful fundraising event. Bob works tirelessly for the Club but he cannot do everything on his own so please offer your support.

1. Apologies Received – See above

2. Membership Reports

a. Latest Membership count – Bob Hayter reported that we now have 329 members including the 41 new members who have joined this year to date.

3. Dress Code

- a. A proposal to change the existing dress code regulations was proposed by Alan Jaye and seconded by Bob Hayter.
- b. A copy of the new dress code recommendations was distributed to all management team members prior to the meeting.
- c. The revised dress code as distributed, was approved unanimously by all present and will now be circulated to all members. A copy will also be put on the main notice boards

4. Financial and Staffing Reports

- a. Whilst our financial position is stable, we have to factor in the rising cost of gas and electricity and other general expenses which will rise substantially in 2024 when our fixed term contracts ends.
- b. With the volatile interest rates, AJ agreed to review our fixed term account with Virgin Money when the contract period ends and will keep an eye out for better rates elsewhere.
- c. Sandy Dron again thanked Alan and Bob for all their hard work setting up and monitoring the finances of the Club and for their prudent spending habits.

5. Staffing report from Bob Hayter

a. Bob Hayter advised that sadly Steve Simpson had decided to stand down from bar duty at the end of the year. Thanks were given to him on behalf of the club, for all his work over many years of loyal service.

- b. This means that it might be necessary to enrol further help in the New Year, to cover periods such as evenings and weekends. Bob Hayter to review the situation as necessary.
- c. Tony Seago respectfully asked his bar colleagues to refrain from entering or playing in matches when they are supposed to be on bar duty. Doing both, is detrimental to the club and to the team they are playing in. This is particularly important at busy times such as Tuesday evenings when we host several outdoor clubs in the Outside In competition.

6. Events, Fundraising, Sponsorship, Publicity and Charity

- a. Quiz Night
 - i. Bob Hayter held one of his legendary quiz nights on the 18th November 2023 and it was another great success.
 - ii. Bob Hayter was disappointed that apart from Tony Seago and Eric Brown who helped with bar duties, no other Management Team members came or offered to help. Arranging these evenings takes a lot of time and effort and it is imperative that Management Team Members support the events and help set things up if Bob is to hold further quizzes in the future.
 - iii. Sincere thanks to Glenn and Jacquie Stephens for supply the rolls to supplement the food.
 - iv. The evening raised £241 for our Charity Tracy's Trust.
 - v. This means that the total raised for our charity so far this season is £429.
 - vi. Thanks were expressed by Bob to Tony and Eric for their help and Alan Bayliss gave thanks to Bob and his wife Sandra for all their efforts, particularly on the evening.
- b. The free membership raffles will start at the beginning of December. The winners will each receive 1 year's free membership.
 - i. The number of raffles will depend on the interest shown.
- c. Lottery The lottery was won this session by Sandra Hayter who took away a healthy £799. Bob said he would throw in a £1 to make it up to a round figure!
 - i. In the 3 years the lottery has been going, we have raised over £1000 for the Club.
 - ii. New members are welcome to join the next lottery session which starts now. Please ask Mo at the bar for further details. Already 12 new lottery members have signed up.
- d. Our Target Bowls Competition will resume at Christmas, subject to enough interest from the members.
- e. Sponsorship
 - i. Steve Klein is in negotiations with local Estate Agents regarding sponsoring the Club or some of its events or competitions.
 - ii. If you know of anyone else who wishes to sponsor us, please give your details to Steve Klein who will follow this up on your behalf.
 - iii. The advertising screen in the lounge has generated some interest amongst members. This system is updated regularly with important information about club rules, events and items of interest so please read the screen if you are in the lounge.  - iii. AJ, Bob and Steve Klein will be meeting up with the caterer very soon to agree the menu for the day.

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- iv. It is probable that this season, we will provide a sit down meal rather than a finger buffet as this will prevent attendees standing by the kitchen door and pouncing on the waitresses as they come out.
- v. Bowls Wear Direct have agreed to attend as our appointed bowls wear suppliers.
- vi. Lexus, our sponsors, will attend with two cars on show.
- vii. Pat Brown and her team have agreed to organise the raffle, tombola and white elephant table.
- viii. Members to be asked to bring their donations of gifts for the raffle/tombola or White Elephant table to the club **BUT not before Christmas please.**
- ix. Volunteers will be needed on the day to staff the car parks, tidy up, help the caterer, meet and greet the players, our members and guests and a variety of other essential duties. A list will be put up in the club, nearer to the event.
- x. Bob to invite last year's clubs to participate.

b. Christmas Raffle

- i. This is in addition to the Gala Day Raffle. Please bring your donations of gifts for the **Christmas raffle only**, to the Club as soon as possible.
- ii. These should be good quality NEW items rather the sort of things we expect to receive for the Gala day tombola or White Elephant Table. If no gifts are donated, we will have to buy suitable gifts out of the Club's funds so please give generously if you possibly can.

8. Leagues and Match Reports

- a. The Leagues are running quite well but there have been a few cancellations due to team captains not being able to get a team together on the day.
 - i. Team Captains, if you are short of players, PLEASE look at the list of available players looking for a game in a league. We have over 40 new members, not all novices who would dearly like to take part in our leagues. There is no excuse for a team not turning up due to a lack of players in the squad and you cannot rely on a spare member who just happens to be sitting in the lounge.
 - ii. For members not already in a league, it's not too late to sign up. There is a list at the bar for any members who wish to join one of our leagues. Please enter your name if you are interested and one of our team captains will be in touch, subject to availability.

b. Markers

- i. It has been bought to our attention that members are asking new and inexperienced bowlers to mark championship games for them. With respect to the NEW markers who were asked, there is more to marking a game than standing at the head and shouting 18" short etc.
- ii. A marker should have at least 2 years bowls experience and must be aware of the rules and the etiquette of the game. They must know how to measure, how to use callipers when necessary and what to do when a bowl goes into a ditch etc. Our Assistant Secretary Ian Dunn is making enquiries about Marking Courses and will come back to us with his findings.
- iii. There is a list of qualified markers on the notice board. If you are experienced and want to, you can add your name to that list so that anyone who needs a marker can get in touch.
- c. Outdoor Indoor League is running well but there are some clubs running behind in their matches. These clubs need to catch up soon else games may be cancelled and points lost.

d. Friendly Matches

- i. Congratulations to the women for beating our men last week. No hard feelings from the men despite a lot of sulking!
- ii. The Weekend Friendly matches are generally oversubscribed which is good for the Club if not the players. If you put your name down for a match, please ensure that you are available to play. If you cannot play, please contact Sonia or Ken (or the match organiser) as soon as possible so that they can find a replacement.
- iii. Not everyone gets selected but the organisers do their best to ensure that games are evenly
- iv. The forthcoming match against Elm Park has been cancelled by Elm Park due to lack of players.

v. Ken Spicer gave a vote of thanks to Sonia McDonald for all her hard work in arranging these games and ensuring they run smoothly.

e. The Bob Kane Newbies Competition

- As we now have over 40 new members, we will be holding another Newbies Competition on Wednesday 27th March 2024. Invitations have already been sent out to any eligible player who joined the club in 2023, whether experienced or not.

i. County Delegates Report – Bob Kane

- i. Bob Kane sent out two County Delegates Reports. There were no comments or matters arising.
- ii. With the women and gents sections now amalgamated, getting a County game is more difficult.
- iii. Bob Kane is trying to get the County to arrange more games but not having much success at the moment.
- iv. The County Roll has been adjusted and the Management Team were advised.
- v. There was a discussion on how to get on the County roll which is much more difficult now that the women and gents divisions have been combined. Full details can be found on page 80 of the Essex County Handbook.

9. Coaching and Etiquette

a. Karl Bunyan updated the Team regarding the progress of the Etiquette training. He was disappointed with the uptake of the sessions.

- b. He expressed concern that not everyone could find time on a Wednesday afternoon to attend a session.
 - i. The Club's problem is finding time on other days as the rinks are fully booked at this time of year with championship matches and County games and an increased demand for roll ups.
 - ii. Maybe some of the sessions could be held in the lounge rather than on the green?
- c. Of the 4 sessions offered, only 2 people signed and one joined on the day.
- d. The session held was conducted by Alan Bayliss and went well, enjoyed by all and very informative.
- e. The Team had a long meeting and worked together to create the content of the sessions and there was a lot of information available.
- f. Karl and the team felt that the name 'Etiquette Team' put members off of joining a session. From now on the Team will be called the **Training Team** and will cover a variety of bowls related do's and don'ts, etiquette and behaviour on and around the greens and the rules of bowls.
- g. ALL members will be encouraged to take part in at least one session.
- h. Karl and the team will put together an email/flyer promoting the sessions in an attempt to attract more members, new and old, to participate. AJ to circulate when ready.
- i. The team will also attend roll up sessions to offer their services to players who maybe do not play regularly in leagues or matches.
- j. From next season, all new members will be required to attend at least one of these training courses where they will learn the etiquette of bowls rather than just how to play. Knowing what to do on and off the green is an important part of the game.
- k. Coaching and training can be carried out at the club on a Wednesday afternoon subject to rink availability and by arrangement.
- The Team consists of, Mark Newman, Darrell Witek, Alan Bayliss, Karl Bunyan, Steve Simpson, Bernice Gilbert and Sandra Dupuy and their names will be mentioned in any future emails or correspondence related to this subject so that any member wishing to sign up or speak to a Team member, knows who to contact.
- m. Coaching The club will look into the cost of sending one or more members on a level one coaching course. Subject to the costs involved and the availability, the Club may support a coaching course financially.
- n. Maybe there are evening courses available?
- o. It was also suggested that we might be able to get sponsorship or a grant to send one or more members on a course? Steven Klein to look into Sponsorship. Alan to look into possible grants.
- p. Ian Dunn to look into the cost of Coaching and Marking courses and report back.

10. Health, Safety & Security

- a. There was no response to our appeal for more first aiders. We will continue asking for anyone interested and looking for available courses.
 - i. The importance of this was evident at the end of the meeting when one of our members was taken ill on the green with suspected heart problems. Vince Allen and Alan Jaye, both qualified first aiders, attended to the member and kept him comfortable until the paramedics arrived. I am pleased to report that our member has recovered but is undergoing tests for a non-heart related problem.
- b. Ian, Vince and Bob carried out further risk assessments and one or two minor problems came to light. All have, or are about to be, resolved.
- c. Further risk assessments will be done on a monthly basis.
- d. Bob Kane continues to carry Cosht assessments on products used and these are filed accordingly.
- e. The fire alarm was tested and will be tested again throughout the season. Players will be warned in advance but will be expected to evacuate so that the H&S Team know what to do in a real emergency. All members are asked to cooperate.
- f. In the event of a fire, all able bodied members must try to ensure that less able, deaf or partially sighted members are warned to evacuate, as long as they do not endanger their own lives.
