to bowls in the main, it is not always possible to

understand all the rules and regulations, both on and off of the green. We can teach you the basics of how to stand and how to deliver a bowl but we do not explain the etiquette and rules of the game of bowls. Unfortunately, that leads to some unintentional and unfortunate 'behaviour' both on and off of the green. Things like talking whilst someone is trying to bowl and having a chat in the middle of the green whilst others on adjacent rinks are trying to play. Where to stand when the number three is measuring. None of these seem very important but they can be very annoying if someone is playing an important game, with or next to you. As from September, ALL new members will be required to attend a 1 hour training course within 1 month of joining. This is not a test of their ability, it is to explain the rules and etiquette of the game and what we expect of our members **at Ilford**. Whilst this is aimed at new members, we **strongly** recommend that ALL members (YOU included) sign up for a course as even established bowlers slip into bad habits. These training courses are run by Karl Bunyan and Sandra Dupuy and they have enrolled a small team of experienced bowlers to help. This club does operate a mixed play policy which means that women can play in men's leagues. If any lady (or gent) is looking to join a league, please let me know which days and what times you would like to play. I have prepared a list and will send that out to all team captains just before the start of the next season.

It was our intention to resurface the entire car park during the summer break. Unfortunately, the estimates we received came in at over £49,000 plus VAT, money we do not have available nor wish to use for that purpose. Thanks to Ian and his negotiating skills, we are now going to repair the most seriously damaged areas in the car park so that we comply with health and safety regulations and so that the car park is safe and level for you. We will also repaint all the white lines. You will be pleased to know that we have resisted the temptation to sublet the car park to a parking company. They would have funded the resurfacing but also introduced car parking charges, something the Directors are reluctant to do.

During the summer, Tony Seago has started redecorating the lounge area and is making good progress. This will give our lounge a new fresh look and make it a more inviting place to relax, before and after your game of bowls. Once finished, Bob is looking at renewing some of the lounge furniture. Whatever he chooses will have to be portable so that it can be moved away for functions, meetings and of course the school exams. One slight regret is that we will be retaining our dated Axminster carpet. Whilst very outdated and old fashioned, it covers a multitude of tea, coffee and beer stains and will probably outlive most of us. It will just not wear out!

We already have our new trophy cabinet and the message pigeon holes will be relocated into the playing area once the work is complete. Details of fixtures and inter-member messages, are placed in these receptacles so please do not forget to look for YOUR messages each time you visit the club.

**Please do not contact Bob or me about your 24/25 league fixtures**. They are still being worked on, along with other important matches and events. The fixtures along with the new handbook, will be distributed as soon as possible and before the new season starts. I can tell you that we currently have 27 weekend friendly matches arranged with a possibility of a few more to come. If your outdoor club would like to play a game at Ilford, please contact Mark Newman (07984 085826) or Bob Hayter (07505 171682) for more information. You need to act guickly as the handbook goes to print in a couple of weeks.

We also still have a limited amount of handbook advertising space available. Adverts cost  $\pounds$ 200 for a page in full colour,  $\pounds$ 100 for a full page in black and white and just  $\pounds$ 60 for a black and white half page. Again, we must receive your draft ad within the next 2 weeks before the handbooks go to print, The money raised goes to offset the cost of the handbooks and anything left over, towards sponsoring the various competitions. Please support the club by advertising with us.

We hope to have 3 fun competitions during the 24/25 season subject to enough interest. Our now annual Newbies Competition for new members of all abilities, a Class of 2021/23 competition for members who joined in 2021 to 2023 and a repeat of the hugely competitive and popular Football Bowls Competition run by Brian Yershon which I think all will agree was great fun. If you have any ideas for new competitions, please let me know and I will put your ideas to the Management Team when we next meet. You need to provide some details though such as how it will be run, rules and regulations and who will be running it. Something to think about though?

#### Dress Code

Please remember that our new dress code which was agreed at the last AGM, comes into force in September when the club re-opens for league play. However, the first week of the season will be dress optional to try to encourage new members to try the sport. We have spent far too many hours debating and altering the code and we now have to take a more forceful stance. It is not something we as a club want but we will operate a 'three strikes' and out rule for anyone not complying. On the first occasion, you will politely be asked to comply. If this does not encourage you, we will send you a written warning and on the third offence, you will be asked to leave the green and could ultimately be suspended from the Club. Details of the dress code were sent out with the AGM minutes, will be published in the new handbook and will be posted on the Notice Board when we reopen. For the further avoidance of any doubt, a copy can be seen later in this Newsletter.

The dress code is part of our rules and we ask every member to respect them and comply. We do not think that is too much to ask. One of the main points in the new code is that members will not be allowed to play in their outdoor club shirts and trousers unless they are representing their club in competition. All clubs have a dress code with the possible exception of Walthamstow Borough so PLEASE dress appropriately. The wearing of outdoor shoes on the green is strictly prohibited. Flat soled bowls shoes only.

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Details of the new voucher scheme are shown above so you will be able to save some money if you buy in bulk. If you still have vouchers from last season, they are still valid until they run out. We have not raised annual fees this year so these will remain at £80 for full members and £45 for social. There will be special introductory prices for any new member joining between September and December 2024.

### DRESS CODE for 2024/2025 SEASON

#### <u>Men</u>

The weekday and Sunday league dress code is as follows: - grey/black trousers/bowls approved tracksuit bottoms, or shorts. Ilford club shirts, white collared shirts with sleeves or bowls branded shirts (such as Henselite, Taylors etc.).

Any top (jumper, cardigan, gillets etc.) must be white or pale grey only. All upper attire must be at least 70% white in colour.

#### No outdoor Bowls shirts are allowed unless representing their respective clubs in competition.

The Dress Code for weekend matches when representing Ilford Indoor Bowls Club is: - white trousers/bowls approved tracksuits or shorts and Ilford club shirt only. A plain white collared shirt and club tie will be allowed.

The dress code when representing Ilford in County or National competitions is: - white trousers, bowls approved tracksuits or shorts and Ilford club shirts only, unless otherwise stipulated by the County or organising bowls authority. Please check the Competition Notice Board for further details.

#### Ladies

The weekday and Sunday league dress code is as follows: - grey/black full-length trousers/tracksuits, pleated grey skirts or  $\frac{3}{4}$  length bottoms. white blouse or collared polo shirt, Ilford club shirts or bowls branded shirts (i.e. Henselite, Taylors etc.).

Jumpers or cardigans must be dark blue, white, or pale grey only. All upper attire must be at least 70% white in colour.

#### No outdoor bowls shirts unless representing their respective clubs in competition.

Weekend matches when representing Ilford Indoor Bowls Club are white- trousers/tracksuit,  $\frac{3}{4}$  length bottoms and club shirt only. Only dark blue cardigans/jumpers are acceptable.

For all matches when representing Ilford in County or National competitions, the code is club shirts, dark blue cardigans/jumpers only, unless otherwise stipulated by the County or organising bowls authority.

#### <u>Footwear</u>

All shoes worn on the green must be appropriate flat souled or official bowls shoes only, absolutely no other footwear is to be allowed. PLEASE DO NOT WEAR YOUR BOWLS SHOES OUTSIDE OF THE CLUB HOUSE.

#### PLEASE NOTE - Tracksuits means BOWLS APPROVED TRACKSUITS i.e. Henselite, Drakes Pride, Tailors or other approved and recognised makes.

Particularly important for this issue because we are closed until September, if you know of any member who does not have access to emails, please let us know who they are and we will place a copy of this newsletter in their pigeon hole/mail box when the new season begins . <u>This will now be situated behind rink 4</u> where the water machine is.

Members are also reminded to check to see if there are any communications waiting for them in their mail box from the Club, their Team Captain or another member.
