CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS WINNER - DEBBIE JONES by John Kaylor

It was a thrilling day at Tilbury Indoor Bowls Club on December 15th as the Essex Ladies Indoor Bowls Champion of Champions final came down to the wire.

In an epic clash that had supporters on the edge of their seats, Debbie Jones, the Ilford Indoor Bowls Champion, emerged victorious over Shirley Beavis from Falcon Indoor Bowls Club, winning 21-20 in a nail-biting final that stretched to 22 ends.

From the very first bowl, it was clear that both players were in top form, each determined to claim the coveted title. The match was an absolute cracker - tight, tactical, and full of suspense. As the game progressed, it was clear this would be no walk in the park for either of these seasoned bowlers.

The score was neck-and-neck throughout, with both women exchanging blows in what seemed like a never-ending battle of skill and nerve. Shirley, known for her composure, kept the pressure on, but Debbie was having none of it, responding with shot after shot that showed exactly why she's Ilford's top player.

The drama reached its peak on the 22nd and final end- Shirley needed one shot to win, and Debbie needed two shots.

Debbie, with nerves of steel, stepped up to the mat and played her final wood to leave her holding two shots. Shirley had to get inside to take the one point THAT SHE needed, but failed at the final attempt.

It was a well-deserved win for Debbie Jones, who showed incredible resilience and precision under pressure. Shirley Beavis, although narrowly defeated, played superbly throughout the match and certainly earned the respect of everyone in the hall.

All in all, it was a fantastic final that lived up to the hype - a true showcase of indoor bowls at its very best.

For Debbie, the Champion of Champions title is a well-earned reward, and sends her to Poole in late January to compete against the very best in the country for the British Title.

To be the best, you have to beat the best, and Debbie's first opponent is 6 times to date, and current World Indoor Bowls Champion Katherine Rednell.

CHAMPIONSHIP BOOKING SYSTEM

There has been some confusion about the booking system we use to schedule Championship matches. This has led to a few arguments which is the last thing we want. I have been asked to clarify the system.


- 1. The WHITE BOARD to the right of the green is only a diary of forthcoming events and matches. The numbers on the board have now been blanked out as competitors thought that the entries also indicated which rinks they were playing on. This is the Club's fault and apologies to all who were confused by this system.
- 2. When looking to find rink availability for a championship match, please refer to your HANDBOOK first. This will tell you if there are any league or matches on any particular day and on which rinks. If there are no scheduled games in the HANDBOOK, go to point 3 below.
- 3. ALL Championship matches must be entered in the **MATCH BOOK** situated on the table near the greenside of the bar. If there are more than one championship games in the book, rinks should be drawn to decide which rink to play on.
- 4. For full rink games and triples you need to book and pay for 2 sessions, as these games take longer.
- 5. If you are still not sure, please speak to Bob Hayter.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS

At the time of writing, there are still over 100 members who have not paid their fees which are due by the 31st December. Please pay at the bar when the Club reopens and fill in a renewal membership form, which is required by GDPR regulations. **Please clearly indicate if there have been any changes** such as email addresses, telephone numbers, next of kin and postal addresses. There is also an **optional** medical form which is included at the request of the London Ambulance Service. This is to provide them with medical information about you in the event of an emergency at the Club. Payment of fees can be made online or at the bar, by cash or card. Our bank details are on the renewal application form.

If you are not intending to re-join or wish to convert to Non-Playing Social membership, **please let me know ASAP** so that we can amend your records accordingly.


