We hope that you are continuing to enjoy playing bowls and socialising here at Ilford. It continues to be the Club's number one priority to ensure that you have the best possible bowls experience in the friendliest possible environment. We are not perfect but the Management of the Club do their best. However, we are about to enter a period of uncertainty and change, prompted by some high level management resignations.

In February, our Director Gerry Gillan decided to step down with immediate effect, due to some health issues. This seems to have prompted other members of the team to consider their own circumstances. Gerry will continue to assist the Club with his photographic skills and we thank him for all his efforts and help over the years.

The Club's gents Captain, Ken Spicer, who has served this club and his outdoor club, Wanstead Central, tirelessly for many years, announced that he was taking a year's 'sabbatical' and relinquishing captaincy of his internal league teams. Fortunately, he has managed to find other team members to run his teams so the impact on the leagues should be minimal. Ken is also offering to step down as gents Captain, initially during this period, if a suitable candidate can be found to take over. He has been the Gents Club Captain for many years and just needs a break to spend more time with his lovely wife Brenda and to refresh his enthusiasm for the task of Captaincy. He is aware that he has been so involved with literally rebuilding Wanstead Central that he has somewhat neglected Ilford and placed an increasing burden on our Ladies Captain, Sonia McDonald who arranges most of the weekend friendlies. Ken is not leaving, just taking a well-earned rest. He will remain as the Over 60's A team Manager, if voted in at the AGM in April and will stay on as Gents Captain if no one else put's their name forward to take over.

Our President, Pat Brown has served the Club for many years and became President in 2014. I am sure she will not mind me mentioning that she is approaching a BIG birthday and as such feels she needs to hand over the mantle of presidency and her other offices in the Club. John Kaylor has kindly prepared a tribute to her which you will find later in this Newsletter.

Only this week, our Chairman, Sandy Dron, also took the decision not to stand as Chairman and will step down at the end of this season. Sandy too, has served the Club in many roles and was instrumental in creating and enforcing our Memorandum and Articles of Association. He is also a life member of the Club and we hope he will continue to bowl at Ilford for many more years to come.

Probably the biggest unexpected change in management was the announcement at the last Management Meeting that both Bob Hayter and I will be standing down from our various roles, Bob as Club Manager, Treasurer, League and Competitions Secretary and bar manager and me as General Secretary, with effect from the end of the 2026/2027 season (April 2027). Like Pat, Bob will be approaching a big birthday, in his case 70 and I will be approaching 80 years old. Bob will have served the club for almost 9 years and myself for 8 years. We both feel that it is time to hand over to younger people with fresh ideas and renewed enthusiasm. We need to secure the future of the Club and have given two years notice so that there is time to train up whoever takes over. Without blowing our own trumpets (too much), most members have no idea of what goes on behind the scenes or what it takes to run a successful club, and successful Ilford really is.

Bob and I have built a financially strong club. We have not done this on our own as we have a good team of people around us but most members only see the tip of the iceberg and not our feet paddling away under the water. We live in very different times and we are swamped with laws and regulations, and have to cope with safeguarding, mental health, energy costs, a woke society and many other challenges that no one else really sees or worries about. Added to this, our lease comes up for renewal in March 2027 and although we have an option to renew for 10 years, it WILL come at a cost. We are situated on prime land and the Council will not be kind to us. If the lease renewal is not dealt with properly, we could see a threefold increase in rent on top of other running costs. If we have to EMPLOY a new Club Manager and a new General Secretary, we could be looking at a massive wage bill and inevitably, increases in annual and green fees. With this in mind, we have to try to continue to run the Club with the volunteers we have and new blood to take over these important roles. It is a big ask but members need to step forward to take over.

On the plus side, we welcome Lesley Doel who has agreed to join our bar team and has already been a big hit with our members. I have a feeling Lesley will not stand for any nonsense.

The AGM will take place on SUNDAY 6th April 2025 at 9:30 am. The Notice of Meeting will be sent out in the next week and I have already invited nominations for all the Management Roles, plus Director vacancies, and these can be found on the two main notice boards in the playing area. Even if a position is already filled, there is nothing stopping you putting your name forward. A secret ballot will be taken at the AGM so that everyone has a fair chance of being elected. We invite ALL members, new and old to get involved and help run the club and if you are interested in any of the positions mentioned above but want more information, please come and speak to Bob or me in confidence.

We also invite all members to nominate a charity for the 2025/2026 season. The lists are also on the Notice Boards. Every charity supports a worthy cause but please try and find a different charity this year. As worthy as they are, we have supported the Air Ambulance Service during 2 of the last 4 years and before that Haven House. So maybe something different this year or a smaller/local charity?

Several rule changes were put forward at the last Management Meeting but were voted down by those present so unless something else comes up before the 23rd March which is the deadline for any other proposals, there will be no changes put to the members. However, it has been agreed to increase the annual fee for full members from £80 to £90 per season with effect from the 1st January 2026. Green fees will not go up next season and it is only because we have been financially prudent that we have managed to keep our fees so low. We are still the cheapest club in the area and our bar prices are also very competitive despite recent increases due to price rises of beers, soft drinks and snacks.

GALA

We had another successful Gala in February although our footfall was well down as were the taking on the raffle, tombola and White Elephant stall. Our thanks to all those involved in organising the event and helping out on the day, particularly the kitchen helpers, car park operatives, raffle ticket sellers and the few who stayed behind to clear up. Where were you on the day? It is another example of the apathy which tends to manifest itself at events like this and another reason why I fear for the future of the club.

Well done to Mark Banning, Sonia McDonald, Dennis Tuerena and Gary North, team Lexus/Toyota, who were winners of the competition and of course also sponsored us. We hope that Lexus/Toyota will sponsor us next year but if you are looking to buy a Lexus or Toyota car from Hills Woodford, please mention us. Not only will you get a decent deal but also it will help the Club get the sponsorship we need.



If anyone has ideas on how we can improve the Gala or new ideas on how to make it more attractive to our members and visitors, please let Bob or I know.

<u>A Tribute to Pat Brown: A Remarkable Legacy at Ilford & District Indoor Bowls Club</u> <u>By John Kaylor - Press & Communications Officer</u>

As Pat Brown steps down from her position as President of Ilford & District Indoor Bowls Club, we reflect on her extraordinary journey, a path marked by dedication, resilience, and an unwavering love for the game of bowls. Her retirement in 2025 marks the end of an era that began when the club itself was only a construction site.

Pat's story is one of strength in the face of adversity. Widowed at just 44, she found solace and a sense of community in the sport of bowls, stepping away from her demanding job in the City as an accounting machine operator. Little did she know that this decision would shape her life in ways beyond her imagination.

Having played at Rainham Bowls Club for over four decades, where she held nearly every significant position from Secretary to Ladies Captain to President, Pat's experience and leadership were well established. But it was in 1984, when a friend suggested starting indoor bowls in Ilford, that Pat found herself part of something truly special.

Her passion for bowls didn't just stop at the local level. Pat was the Ladies Vice-Captain, then Captain, Secretary, and, ultimately, President of the club from 2014. Along the way, she maintained an impeccable standard of play and remained active in the wider bowls community, becoming a County Umpire and Marker, as well as serving as Essex County Ladies Indoor Bowling Association's President in 2003. She was also a key representative for Ilford at Essex County.

Through it all, Pat has been a tireless advocate for the club, a mentor, a leader, and a friend to all who have had the privilege of working with her. Her contributions go far beyond her titles. She's been a constant presence, a source of wisdom, and a beacon of positivity, never allowing the challenges of life to overshadow her commitment to the sport and the people around her.

As she steps down from her presidency, we want to extend our deepest gratitude to Pat for a lifetime of service to bowls, to Ilford & District Indoor Bowls Club, and to the broader bowls community. Her legacy will live on in the club she helped build, in the traditions she established, and in the countless lives she has touched along the way.

Pat, thank you for everything. You may be retiring from the presidency, but you will always remain a cherished part of this club's heart. We wish you all the best in the next chapter of your life—may it be filled with the same joy, passion, and community that you so generously gave to all of us over the years. You will be missed, but your influence will never be forgotten.





Membership Reports

Alan Jaye advised that 48 members have not renewed for 2025 for a variety of reasons. One of those being age and health related and not being able to bowl.

To avoid losing members completely, and so that the members concerned can still meet with friends at the Club, Bob Hayter and Alan Jaye agreed to introduce a TEMPORARY new class of membership called NON-PLAYING SOCIAL. Members in this group can use the Club's facilities, attend events but will not be permitted to bowl. The cost of this membership is £20 a year and so far 5 retiring members have joined this group.

AJ asked that this new membership class be adopted permanently, at the next AGM in April.

This suggestion was formally proposed by Alan Bayliss and seconded by Karl Bunyan and will be put to the membership at the AGM.

Membership figures as at 19/2/25 are as follows: -

Our thanks to all those members who added a voluntary donation to their annual fees which raised a total of $\pounds 645$ for the club.

The question of annual and green fees was discussed at length. Whilst the Club remains financially stable, there are many factors that give the Management Team cause for concern. For example, the cost of gas and electricity and water have tripled in a year despite new contracts to protect the Club against further increases for some years. (See note below). It was also pointed out that the Club's lease expires in March 2027 and whilst we do have an optional lease extension clause that will come at a cost, given our location and the value of the land our Club sits on. Members should not be surprised to see our rent rise substantially.

It was therefore decided by vote, that the cost of Full Membership should be raised to £90 per annum wef 1^{st} January 2026.

8 votes for, 2 against and 4 abstentions.

Social Membership will remain at £45 as we only have 6 social members. Junior and NP Social will remain at £20 pa

As green fees were raised at the last AGM, these fees will remain the same for 2026.

The fee increases were agreed by the majority of those present, proposed by John Kaylor and seconded by Philip Fagelson and will be put to the membership at the next AGM.

Financial updates from Bob Hayter

Bob Hayter advised that the club remains financially sound.

A further sum will be transferred to an interest-bearing account to provide for future expenditure in accordance with our 5-year plan.

AJ advised that the one-year deal with Virgin Money comes to an end in March. AJ to search out investment opportunities and open a new account or renew as appropriate.

Due to escalating costs of beers and soft drinks, the Club have no option other to increase bar prices with immediate effect. We cannot afford to sell at a loss. We are still by far the cheapest bowls club bar in the area.

Gas and electricity prices have risen threefold since this time last year. Bob Hayter gave the example that in November/December 2023 we spent £560. We spent £1500 in the same months in 2024. This is despite negotiating very good fixed prices at the end of last season. This indicates that the Club MUST keep inflation in mind when deciding on fees and prices.

Staffing Reports

Bob Hayter has now prepared a bar rota schedule and this seems to be working quite well. The bar is covered at most times of the day thanks to Bob, Tony Seago, Alan Bayliss, Mickey Pace, Mark Newman, Eric Brown and Steve Simpson.

Steve Simpson has announced that he will be stepping back from helping out with bar duties. However, he has since agreed to help out when needed, mainly weekends, but will still help with locking up from time to time, when called upon. Our thanks to Steve and his wife Diana for all their help over the years.

Thanks indeed to ALL the Bar team who take a lot of flak from the members but cope admirably well under sometimes trying conditions.

We welcome Lesley Doel to the Bar Team and we hope she will be able to cover some of the times when we are stretched. Thank you, Lesley, for stepping in to help.

We still hope that, Mo Leung, will return to the Club next season and Bob will be in touch with her to see if this is a likelihood.

Road Restrictions - Redbridge Schools Streets Scheme

There was no further news on the proposed road restrictions despite AJ sending two emails to the Council. Our fear is that the Council will just go ahead and impose the restrictions without further recourse, although they have promised this will not happen.

Gala 2025

The Gala was not as financially successful as in previous years and there was a marked decrease in the number of members who did not visit the club to show their support or help out. The attendance in the afternoon was negligible.

The event still managed to raise £628 for our charity and a further £428 bar takings for the club.

The White Elephant table was particularly poor. This can be seen by the amount of goods still on the table, over 2 weeks from the event. This is not the opportunity to get rid of a lot of rubbish. It is designed to give members the opportunity to recycle new or fairly new undamaged items. The table will be removed very soon, should any member wish to buy anything. Anything else will be disposed of.

The actual Competition was however, very successful and was won by our Sponsors, Mark Banning of Toyota Lexus, and his team of Gary North, Dennis Tuerena and our own ladies Captain, Sonia McDonald. Well done to them.

AJ felt that the format of the competition needs reviewing. It has become tired and stale and new ideas to raise funds are required. If any member has a feasible idea to improve the event, please let us know.

Maybe having a 3rd v 4th playoff might help?

John Kaylor offered to sponsor £100 for the best individual score on the day. This would be presented at the end of the competition. Thank you, John.

We also need to keep visitors and bowlers on site to witness the address by our sponsors and the presentation to the winning teams and Bob Hayter will be looking at ideas to do this in the future. It is a slight to our guest of honour when only a handful of people stay to listen to what they have to say. Bob Hayter advised that we had received a commission cheque for £61 from Bowls Direct.

Messages of thanks have been sent out to Paul Goff and Andrew Catley of Bruce Allen & Co (our Accountants and guests of honour), Dawn Moores, our caterer and of course to our sponsors, Lexus of Woodford.

Thanks also to Steve Klein for his generous donation and all our helpers on the day.

It was suggested that next year, we try to get a Guest of Honour with a celebrity or sports profile, which might attract more visitors. If anyone has a contact, please let Bob or I know.

Events, Fundraising, Sponsorship, Publicity and Charity

The Charity Quiz in December was a sell out as usual and raised £239 for the LAA.

The Christmas raffle raised £361.50.

We have so far collected over £1200 for the Charity, some of which has still to be collected.

Please note that a notice has already gone up on both Notice Boards for nominations for our charity for the 2025/2026 season. Please enter the names as soon as possible. A vote will be taken at the AGM in April.

The Restaurant Voucher scheme is still being finalised but will probably not be operational until the 25/26 season.

No other events planned but we are open for ideas for 25/26.

Internal Leagues, Club Championships and Match Reports

Championships are progressing well and reaching the crucial semi-final stage.

League application forms for the 25/26 season are now ready for collection from the office. If you are standing down as a team Captain, PLEASE try to find another member of your team to take over.

Every team we lose costs the club upwards of \pounds 400 a season plus bar takings etc.

It was agreed at the previous meeting that every team member should be obliged to pay the Team Captain £2 per season, to cover the cost of entry and administration, laid out by the Team Captain, The Team Captain is to collect this from his team members. The Team Captain is still responsible for entering and paying for his/her team regardless of what they collect.

It was suggested by Stuart Nieman that any amount collected, over and above the £10 entrance fee, is donated to the Charity, however, this is voluntary and does not involve the Club.

Summer Triples League Monday, Wednesday and Fridays 10:30 to 12:30 between August and September

Mark Newman finalising the format of the proposed league and will give to Alan Jaye within a week.

Tea and coffee will be available to purchase.

Once received and agreed, AJ will circulate to interested members.

Mark Newman to be responsible for locking up and the security of the Club.

Bob Hayter to check when school will be vacating the Club and when the boards can come up.

Sonia McDonald advised that she had had a lot of difficulty this season with players and teams not turning up, and even visitors. This is not acceptable. Please do not enter these matches if you cannot fulfil the fixtures.

One of the problems relates to husband and wives in teams as if they do not turn up for matches, the game has to be cancelled.

Sonia will try to ensure that everyone who supports the Weekend Friendly program, does get a game. County League and County Over 60's League Reports

Bob Kane sent a County Delegates Report which was distributed to the members.

Ken Spicer's Over 60's league reports were read out at this meeting.

Ilford B team came 7th out of the 8 teams involved.

Copy of the report available by request.

It was generally thought that there are too many players in the Over 60's squads. Squads should be limited to 16 players in each. Further discussion on this at the next MT Meeting.

Coaching and 'Bowls' Training report and update - Karl Bunyan

Nothing to report at this meeting.

Maintenance reports

There were no major maintenance issues to discuss.

Bob Hayter advised that he was looking into the cost of protecting our wall mural against damage from the chairs and from potential damage caused by the school when in occupation. This will be covered in part with Perspex at an estimated cost of £1500. This was agreed by those present.

It has been advised that **all** analogue telephone lines will be discontinued during 2025. Ian Dunn is looking at prices to update and modernise our existing telephone system.

Quotes have been received and a further quotation is expected from our existing supplier, AEON, in the next few days.

Our thanks were given to Ian Treleaven for his continued work in keeping the gardens in good order.

It should be remembered that before Ian became involved in this work, we has an enormous weed problem and since then, this has not been a problem thanks to his efforts.

During last summer, repairs were carried out to the car park. Further work will be carried out in the summer of this year in other areas of the car park and pathways and to repair some of the fences which are damaged. Ian Dunn is tasked with arranging this work.

Provisions for this costly work is included in our 5 year business plan.

John Kaylor did send an article and pictures of our mural, to Bowls International. However, they did not publish anything which is disappointing. Thanks to John for trying though.

Health, Safety, Human Resources and Security (including Covid)

A report from Ian Dunn and Vince Allen was distributed with the Agenda to this meeting. There were no comments.

Ian Dunn reported that we have to arrange an asbestos survey during the summer. He will liaise with contractors on this.

Whilst the situation is better, storage of items in changing rooms is still a problem and a Health and Safety issue. We know we are short of space but leaving bags and bowls accessories at the club for long periods is not acceptable. Nor is it acceptable to leave shoes, bags and equipment on the chairs in the playing area thus preventing players sitting down during their games.

Shoes, Bags and cases are still being left on seats despite several messages to our members not to do this.

Bags and shoes must be stored short term, UNDER the benches. Not on the floor next to the benches, in the corridors or anywhere in the playing area.

Due to several important changes in the law, our H&S Consultants have advised that we need to review out Human Resources system at a cost of ± 160 a month.

AJ advised that as the Club only have 2 employees, we could not commit to paying this amount.

We will look at the contracts of employment and may make revisions if advised by ACAS. There were no other reported matters.

Summer opening Proposal from Mark Newman

Mark Newman read out his proposal to open the club in the summer for a six-week period, after the school have vacated, on Monday's, Wednesdays and Fridays between 10:30 and 2:00pm.

BH expressed concerns about the running cost of opening the club during that time. He also mentioned that the bar would not be stocked so only tea and coffee could be served.

It was pointed out that this six-week period is the club's only chance to carry out redecoration, high level repairs or renewals.

The club would be opened, and closed, by Mark and he would be responsible for ensuring that the club was kept clean and tidy and all the washing up done before leaving the clubhouse.

Sonia McDonald agreed to help with arranging and running the proposed summer league and to help with refreshments.

BH to find out if staff from the school would be available to help with and store the boards at the end of the exam season.

Date of next meeting

The date of the next meeting will be advised.

MT members are requested NOT to book games for the afternoons of the management meetings, if possible. We struggled to discuss several important items and cannot be restricted with times. There are only 3 or 4 meetings a season and it is not unreasonable to expect the management to attend and stay until business is properly concluded.

AJ appreciates that these meetings do sometimes drag on and will try to keep the Agenda shorter and to the point.

Important issues will be moved to the top so that they can be discussed first.

League Matches, County Fixtures and Friendlies

Please do not put your name down for any matches if there is any known chance of you not being able to play! If you do have to pull out of any match, you must either arrange a suitable replacement or contact your Team Captain or the Competition Organiser immediately, so that they have ample time to find a replacement for you.

Persistent offenders (and there are some) may be removed from a league team or not chosen for future matches.

Not turning up is disrespectful and not fair to your team, Team Captain or the Club, as matches have to be cancelled or the team are penalised for not fielding a full squad.

Note to Team Managers

It would be appreciated if Team Captains could limit the number of players in their teams, to a maximum of 10. This will give individual team members more games during a season.

There are some teams who only have squads of 5 or 6 players and desperately need more to cover all the games. It will also give players the chance to create their own teams and help the Club fill league places if available.

If interested in entering a team of your own, please speak to Bob Hayter.

It is respectfully suggested that you remind your team players a few days before any match, to ensure they know they are playing. We all make mistakes from time to time (*me included* ®) and forget we are due to play so a quick WhatsApp, text message, email or phone call will help remind the players to turn up. Unfortunately, it's part of the job of Team Captain!

If members regularly fail to turn up for matches, the Club might have to introduce a penalty system for either the player concerned or the team.

Team Captains can ask a player to step in and help out if one of their players does not turn up but that player can only play at position 2. The player cannot play against their own team. MOST members are abiding by the Club's dress code but there are still a handful who push the limits. YOU know who you are so don't do it, or we will name and shame you!

Be respectful to other members and yourself. Clothes should also be clean and crease free.

Copies of the dress code are on the Notice Board, in the Handbook and can be obtained from the office.

Members wishing to play in County or friendly inter-club games MUST be willing to travel away on occasions. It is not fair to expect the same people every time, to travel to away games.

It is an honour to play for our Club and a great experience, home or away.

If you notice any hazards or dangerous objects or areas of the club, please immediately report it to our Health & Safety Director or the office.
